THEME: YEAR OF INNOVATION

Outdoor Afro's Black History Month coverage for 2024 acknowledges the nature contributions of international botanist, scientist, and educator George Washington Carver. Known as “The Peanut Man,” Carver invented more than 300 products connected to the peanut. Coinciding with his ability to design *big* in nature, our organizational theme for this year is “**Year of Innovation.**” We’re pioneering new program collaborations and network activities across the United States that continue to strengthen relationships to local land, water, and wildlife. This year's site and social media storytelling will highlight Carver’s rural community efforts to advance land conservation, and share how we still use his science and solutions in the outdoors today.

WHAT NOT TO USE FOR MESSAGING

Please avoid deficit-framing language and using pain point words when sharing Outdoor Afro's Black History Month 2024 content:

We say "**enslaved**," not **slaves**. Enslaved accurately describes people who were forced to perform labor or services against their will.

George Washington Carver was born an enslaved child. Outdoor Afro's coverage takes an asset-framing approach to remind readers of his agricultural impact to help save our planet.
